

Year 9 - History

Curriculum intent	The Year 9 history curriculum is a study of the nature of power and conflict in the 20 th Century. This unit will provide students with the powerful knowledge necessary to understand the modern world they live in. The first term highlights the inter-war years and the conflict between democracy and dictatorship. Students will examine the nature and impact of protest and the significance of voting. In the spring term, learners will analyse the global impact of conflict. In the summer term, students will turn their focus to civil rights and the consequences of discrimination. They will evaluate how far Black Americans achieved equality – making links to the unit on suffragettes taught in the autumn term. Throughout the year, students will carry out source enquiries and question the utility and reliability of sources. By the end of Year 9, students will be able to recognise and challenge examples of propaganda; both verbally and in writing. Students will be able to discuss current events by making links to the past.
